#### INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 185—Plescia.** An act to amend Sections 218 and 275 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 186—Bogh (Coauthors: Aghazarian, Emmerson, Shirley Horton, Koretz, McCarthy, Negrete McLeod, and Plescia). An act to add Section 6434.5 to the Labor Code, relating to occupational safety and health.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 187—Mountjoy (Principal coauthor: Bogh) (Coauthors: Aghazarian, Benoit, Blakeslee, Cogdill, Daucher, DeVore, Emmerson, Frommer, Garcia, Harman, Haynes, Shirley Horton, Huff, Keene, La Malfa, Leslie, Maze, McCarthy, Plescia, Richman, Runner, Strickland, Tran, Villines, Walters, and Wyland). An act to amend, repeal, and add Sections 3307 and 3311 of the Elections Code, relating to overseas voters.
