ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1543—Alejo. An act to amend Sections 4300, 4301, 4303, 4304, and 4305 of, and to repeal Sections 4302, 4302.5, 4302.6, and 4303.5 of, the Government Code, relating to public contracts.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1544—V. Manuel Pérez. An act to add Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 11050) to Part 1 of Division 3 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, relating to undocumented workers.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1545—V. Manuel Pérez. An act to amend Sections 63000, 63010, 63025.1, 63045, and 63084 of, and to add Article 5.5 (commencing with Section 63047.1) to, the Government Code, relating to economic development, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1546—V. Manuel Pérez. An act to add Article 7 (commencing with Section 9950) to Chapter 2 of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, relating to immigration.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1547—Eng. An act to amend Sections 2923.5, 2923.6, 2924.8, and 2929.3 of the Civil Code, and to amend Section 1161b of the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to mortgages.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1548—Carter (Coauthors: Bill Berryhill and Hill) (Coauthors: Senators Correa, Emmerson, Negrete McLeod, and Wyland). An act to add Section 2417.5 to the Business and Professions Code, relating to the practice of medicine.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1549—Gatto. An act to add Sections 65923, 65923.1, 65923.2, 65923.3, and 65923.4 to, and to add Article 4 (commencing with Section 65946) and Article 4.5 (commencing with Section 65948) to Chapter 4.5 of Division 1 of Title 7 of, the Government Code, relating to development, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1550—Bonilla. An act to amend Section 5068 of, and to add Section 5068.1 to, the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.
