ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1694—Levine. An act to add Section 1183 to the Insurance Code, relating to insurance.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1695—Santiago. An act relating to housing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1696—Lee. An act to amend Section 3120 of the Elections Code, relating to elections.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1698—Maienschein. An act to add and repeal Section 490.3 of the Penal Code, relating to theft.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1699—Maienschein. An act to amend Section 12810 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1700—Maienschein. An act to add Chapter 35 (commencing with Section 7599.110) to Division 7 of Title 1 of the Government Code, relating to theft.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1701—Medina. An act to add Chapter 4.5 (commencing with Section 89427) to Part 55 of Division 8 of Title 3 of the Education Code, relating to the California State University.
