#### **PRAYER**

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Keeley, the following prayer was offered by Assembly Chaplain Rabbi Mona Alfi:

While our nation has long championed the official separation between church and state, we have also understood the value of political action being influenced by the ethical and moral beliefs, that are promoted by religions, that strive to uplift the human spirit and elevate our actions towards one another.

In February of 1795, President George Washington declared a day of national thanksgiving. The Bishop James Madison preached a sermon in honor of the day. On the topic of religion and government he taught that:

"Virtue such as republics and heaven require must have its foundation in the heart; it must penetrate the whole man; it must derive its obligations and its sanctions, not from the changeable ideas of the political moralist, or the caprice of the wisest of human legislators, but from the unchangeable father of the universe, the God of love, Whose laws and Whose will we are incited to obey by motives, the most powerful that can actuate the human soul. Men must see and feel, that it is God Himself, their maker and their judge, Who demands obedience to duties which constitute their individual, their social, their eternal happiness. Then and not till then, will virtue reign triumphant in the hearts of citizens." <sup>1</sup>

Legislators are entrusted by the people with the sacred obligation to enact policies and laws, but, as Bishop Madison suggested, the people hope that their government will not be influenced simply by the changing whims of the political moralists and pundits, but rather by the motivation that their actions have the power to actuate the human soul, to elevate the human condition, and to bring us together in thanksgiving and understanding.

Master of All Creation, we ask of You to grant us humility in the awesome task to which we have been entrusted, we pray that You be an inspiration in our daily actions and that You grant us wisdom and compassion in all of our endeavors.—AMEN.
