> RE: SB 996 (Johnston) Workers' Compensation: Administration and Benefits

Dear Mr. Wilson: As the respective floor manager and author of Senate Bill (SB) 996, and Chair of the Assembly Labor and Employment Committee, we wish to clarify our intent regarding the bill. We amended SB 996 in the Assembly in order to move a bill as soon as possible to a Conference Committee. The contents of this bill nearly mirror SB 320, Senator Solis' workers compensation bill that the Governor vetoed this past year. We intent to place SB 996 in Conference to elicit proposals to increase benefits and improve the efficiency of the workers' compensation system.

Given the complicated nature of the subject, the Legislature has, in the past, successfully employed an extended Conference Committee as the best means of pursuing a consensus bill. We invite persons with an interest and knowledge of the workers' compensation system to put forth their proposals with respect to the changes they would like to see, including the perspectives of workers, the business community, insurers, attorneys, medical providers, and vocational rehabilitation professionals.

We have no intention of submitting SB 996 in its current form to the Governor. The amended version of the bill is being moved without further policy hearing precisely because those issues were debated and voted upon during the first year of the biennium. The earlier this matter can be placed before a Conference Committee, the better able all interested parties will be to place their issues in a public forum. It is our intent that the Conference Committee will provide open discussions and hearings for a full examination of both the issues within this bill and those raised by interested parties, so that these issues may be considered for inclusion in the legislation.

To avoid confusion regarding our intent for SB 996, we respectfully request that this letter be printed in the Assembly Daily Journal.

Dear Mr. Wilson: This letter is to clarify provisions contained in AB 75 (Chapter 764, Statutes of 1999), that require community service districts offering solid waste handling services or waste diversion programs to provide disposal information to the city, county or regional jurisdiction in which they are located. The language of the bill creates an administrative reporting problem for community service districts due to a question of specificity. In many situations, the solid waste services of community service districts often cross multiple local jurisdictions. The reporting requirements of AB 75 will result in waste disposal information being duplicated in the annual reports of the local jurisdictions.

The intent of AB 75 is to require community service districts to report their waste disposal information to only one jurisdiction under the existing waste management system. This will prevent multiple reporting of the data, thereby ensuring the accuracy of the jurisdictions' annual reports.
