Members of the Assembly: Consistent with the Omnibus Audit Accountability Act of 2006 (California Government Code, Sections 8548.7 and 8548.9), the Bureau of State Audits (bureau) presents its special report to the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, Joint Legislative Budget Committee, and Department of Finance. This report notes that from January 2005 through October 2010, the bureau issued 98 reports on audits of state agencies. In those reports, the bureau made 990 recommendations and state agencies had implemented 822, or 83 percent. The remaining 168 recommendations made to 32 state agencies had been outstanding for at least a year and not fully

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will be fully implemented.

implemented. However, based on recent responses obtained from those state agencies, the bureau determined that 40 have been fully implemented and only 128 remain outstanding. In addition to identifying which recommendations have and have not been fully implemented, this report contains written responses from each state agency explaining the status of each recommendation. For recommendations that have not been fully implemented, this report also provides agency responses regarding when or if these recommendations

Our audit efforts bring the greatest returns when agencies act upon our findings and recommendations. For example, in April 2008 the bureau reported that the program the Department of Social Services (Social Services) administers under the state's Safely Surrendered Baby Law (safe-surrender law) would have greater impact if Social Services were to implement several changes to the program. Specifically, the bureau recommended that Social Services clarify the definition of safe surrender for county and state agencies, and then monitor their use of the clarified definition. The bureau also recommended that Social Services revoke the erroneous guidance it had previously issued on the waiver of the privilege of confidentiality by individuals who safely surrender babies. Additionally, the bureau recommended that Social Services consider ways to improve the availability of medical information for surrendered babies. Social Services fully implemented these recommendations in November 2010 by releasing a notice to all county welfare directors that clarified the definition of safe surrender and corrected the erroneous information regarding the waiver of confidentiality. Furthermore, the letter provided an updated form for use by safe surrender site staff designed to improve the availability of medical information that could be vital to the health of a surrendered child. According to Social Services, between January 1, 2001—the date of the safe-surrender law's implementation—and March 31, 2011, parents safely surrendered 407 newborns, while 151 other newborns were found alive following their illegal abandonment. While Social Services has not yet implemented all of the bureau's recommendations, its ongoing improvements to its administrative practices will help to ensure the continuing viability of this life-saving program.

Members of the Assembly: This report presents the results of a follow-up review the Bureau of State Audits (bureau) conducted concerning the efforts by the High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) to implement recommendations from an earlier audit report that we issued in April 2010. The bureau's report titled *High-Speed Rail Authority: It Risks Delays or an Incomplete System Because of Inadequate Planning, Weak Oversight, and Lax Contract Management,* Report 2009-106, examined the Authority's readiness to manage funds authorized for building the high-speed rail network (program) in California, including the \$9 billion in general obligation bonds the voters authorized in November 2008. As a result of our follow-up audit, we concluded that the Authority has fully implemented four recommendations, partially implemented five, and taken no action on the remaining one.

Although the Authority has implemented some of the recommendations we made in our prior report, significant problems persist. For example, the program's overall financial situation has become increasingly risky. This is in part because the Authority has not provided viable funding alternatives in the event that its planned funding does not materialize. In its 2012 draft business plan, the Authority more than doubled its previous cost estimates for phase one of the program, to between \$98.1 billion and \$117.6 billion. Of this amount, the Authority has secured only approximately \$12.5 billion to date. Further, the Authority's 2012 draft business plan still lacks key details about the program's costs and revenues.

In addition to our concerns related to the Authority's 2012 draft business plan, we also identified a number of critical, ongoing problems involving its oversight of the program. Specifically, in part because the Authority is significantly understaffed, it has delegated significant control to its contractors—especially the entity that manages the program (Program Manager). The Authority relies on the Program Manager to provide accurate, consistent, and useful information in its monthly progress reports. However, we found that these reports were often inaccurate and that at times the Program Manager appeared to misinform the Authority about the speed with which contractors for each region performed tasks. Finally, even though the majority of the Authority's role in administering the program involves its management of contracts, we discovered during the course of our work that the Authority had engaged in inappropriate contracting practices involving information technology services. The nature of these problems suggests that the Authority needs to significantly improve its internal controls to ensure that it effectively manages its contracts.

Members of the Assembly: This letter report provides an update on recent events related to the Financial Information System for California (FI\$Cal) project. Pursuant to Government Code, Section 15849.22(e), the State Auditor's Office (state auditor) is required to independently monitor the FI\$Cal project throughout its development, as deemed appropriate by the state auditor. FI\$Cal is a business transformation project for state government in the areas of budgeting, accounting, procurement, and cash management. The independent monitoring shall include, but is not limited to, monitoring the contracts for independent project oversight (IPO) and independent verification and validation (IV&V) services, assessing whether concerns about the project raised by the IPO and IV&V contractors are appropriately addressed by the FI\$Cal steering committee and the FI\$Cal project office within the Department of Finance or its successor entity, and assessing whether the FI\$Cal project is progressing according to schedule and within budget. This is the sixth report we have issued since we began monitoring the FI\$Cal project in 2007.

Government Code, Section 15849.22(e)(2), requires that the state auditor report on the status of the FI\$Cal project at least annually before January 10. Accordingly, we are providing this summary of the events that have occurred since our last status update dated January 6, 2011. In that update report, we reported that the project awarded contracts to three "fit-gap" vendors—Accenture plc, CGI Group, Inc., and International Business Machines Corporation. In addition, we provided updates on our oversight activities, the long-term funding options the project was considering, the project's difficulties in hiring and retaining staff, implementation of the project's new governance model, and trailer bill language to the Budget Act of 2010 that required the project to consider alternative approaches to implementation. Since that time, in April 2011, the project issued an addendum to its third Special Project Report (SPR) to modify its schedule to reflect the impact of factors, such as the former governor's August 2010 directive to cease hiring and the timing of the legislative review of the project's report to the Legislature. In July 2011 the project made further changes to its schedule to allow for additional preparation time for negotiations with the fit-gap vendors. The text box reflects the most recent scheduled completion dates for certain major milestones. As of December 2011 the project completed its negotiations with the three fit-gap vendors and is in the process of evaluating the vendors' final bids. This letter report provides updates on our oversight activities, the status of the project's

long-term funding strategy, its continuing challenges in recruiting and retaining key staff, its slower than anticipated progress in performing data management and change management activities, and the importance of the project's upcoming fourth SPR.
