SENATE BILL NO. 46—An act to amend Sections 6041, 6340, 6520, 6720, 6722, 6851, 6852, 6901, and 13314 of, and to add Section 6901.7 to, the Elections Code, relating to elections.

SENATE BILL NO. 73—An act to amend Section 19230 of the Elections Code, relating to elections, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
