ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1747—Weber. An act to add Section 66025.93 to the Education Code, and to amend Sections 10072, 18904.3, and 18995 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to food assistance.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1748—Mayes. An act to amend Section 48913 of the Education Code, relating to pupils.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1749—Mathis. An act to amend Section 21080.08 of the Public Resources Code, relating to environmental quality.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1750—Dodd. An act to amend Section 2079.13 of the Civil Code, relating to real property transactions.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1757—Waldron. An act to amend Section 96.7 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to local government finance.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1758—Mark Stone. An act to amend Section 281 of, and to add Section 281.1 to, the Public Utilities Code, relating to telecommunications.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1759—Bonta. An act to add Section 39668.5 to, and to add Article 11.3 (commencing with Section 25240) to Chapter 6.5 of Division 20 of, the Health and Safety Code, relating to hydrogen fluoride, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
