ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 214—Chesbro. An act to add Section 1367.27 to the Health and Safety Code, and to add Section 10123.24 to the Insurance Code, relating to health care coverage.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 215—Feuer and Smyth. An act to add Section 1418.21 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to long-term health care facilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 216—Beall. An act to amend Sections 20104 and 20104.2 of the Public Contract Code, relating to public contracts.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 217—Beall. An act to add Article 5.4 (commencing with Section 14180) to Chapter 7 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to Medi-Cal.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 218—Portantino. An act to amend Section 66903 of, to add Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 67050) and Chapter 12.7 (commencing with Section 67070) to Part 40 of Division 5 of Title 3 of, to repeal Sections 66742 and 66743 of, and to repeal Chapter 4.5 (commencing with Section 99180) of Part 65 of Division 14 of Title 3 of, the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education.
