**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 222—Achadjian.** An act to amend Section 4150 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 223—Dahle.** An act to amend Section 101.7 of the Streets and Highways Code, relating to highways.
