ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1689—Quirk-Silva. An act to amend Section 1513 of the Probate Code, and to amend Sections 319, 331, and 728 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to juveniles.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1690—Ahrens. An act to amend Section 17052.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1691—Dixon. An act to add Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 36996) to Division 27 of the Public Resources Code, relating to marine resources.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1692—Pacheco. An act to amend Section 25000 of the Public Resources Code, relating to energy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1693—Zbur (Coauthors: Alanis, Mark González, Solache, Wallis, and Wicks). An act to amend Sections 5886.5 and 6775 of the Business and Professions Code, and to add Chapter 15 (commencing with Section 66350) to Division 1 of Title 7 of the Government Code, relating to retailers.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1694—Carrillo. An act to amend Sections 53071 and 53073 of the Education Code, relating to career technical education.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1695—Ortega. An act to add Chapter 20 (commencing with Section 50899.20) to Part 2 of Division 31 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to housing.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1696—Stefani. An act to amend Section 311 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to professions and vocations.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1697—Kalra. An act to amend Section 92 of the Labor Code, relating to employment.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1698—Alanis. An act to add Sections 17053.65 and 23665 to the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1699—Rogers (Principal coauthor: Hadwick) (Coauthors: Caloza, Connolly, Gallagher, and Wallis) (Coauthors: Senators Arreguín and Grayson). An act to amend Sections 4477, 4493, and 4500 of, to add Sections 4497.3 and 21080.49.1 to, and to repeal Section 4503 of, the Public Resources Code, relating to wildfire, and making an appropriation therefor.
