ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1601—Stone. An act to amend Section 583 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1602—Patterson. An act to amend Section 220.5 of the Streets and Highways Code, and to amend Section 19629 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1603—Stone. An act to add Part 6 (commencing with Section 71450) to Division 34 of, and to repeal Section 71455 of, the Public Resources Code, relating to parks and recreation.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1604—Waldron. An act to amend Section 13995.40 of the Government Code, relating to tourism.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1605—Buchanan. An act to amend Section 5002 of the Public Resources Code, relating to parks and recreation.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1606—Chávez. An act to add Sections 87784.5 and 88207.5 to the Education Code, relating to community colleges.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1607—Fox. An act to amend Section 6608 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to sexually violent predators.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1608—Olsen. An act to amend, repeal, and add Sections 7512.3, 7525.1, 7529, 7538, 7538.5, and 7539 of, and to add and repeal Section 7520.3 of, the Business and Professions Code, relating to private investigators.
