ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 13—V. Manuel Pérez, Bradford, and Skinner. An act to amend Sections 2069 and 2099 of, and to add Sections 2099.10 and 2840 to, the Fish and Game Code, and to amend Section 25524 of, to add Section 25619 to, and to add and repeal Sections 21081.8 and 21097.6 of, the Public Resources Code, relating to renewable energy resources, and making an appropriation therefor.
