INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5—Canciamilla and Richman. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by repealing and adding Section 1 of Article XXI thereof, relating to redistricting.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 6—Canciamilla and Richman. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by amending Section 2 of Article IV thereof, and amending Section 7 of Article XX thereof, relating to term limits.
