**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 47—Wiggins and Thomson. An act to amend Sections 1240.650 and 1245.250 of the Code of Civil Procedure, to amend Sections 56129 and 56133 of the Government Code, and to amend Sections 366 and 11652 of, and to add Sections 851.1 and 1411.1 to, the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 48—Migden. An act to amend Sections 331, 366, and 381 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 49—Bill Campbell. An act to amend Section 25514 of the Public Resources Code, to add Section 633 to the Public Utilities Code, and to add Section 100.8 to the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to public utilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 50—Bates. An act to add Section 46010.4 to the Education Code, and to add Section 2774.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electrical and gas service.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 51—Daucher. An act to add and repeal Section 6353.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.
