Dear Ms. Parker: This is to advise you that as of February 28, 2025, at 5:06 p.m. the unofficial results of the Special Primary Election held on Tuesday, February 25, 2025, for State Assembly District Thirty-Two show that Stan W. Ellis received 38,626 votes or 64.7% of the total number of votes cast for that office.

As of March 3, 2025, at 8:53 a.m., the counties of Kern and Tulare have an estimated 14 unprocessed ballots.

According to the unofficial results, it appears that Stan W. Ellis has received the majority of votes cast for the State Assemblymember Thirty-Second District.

To the best of the Secretary of State's knowledge and belief at this time, there is no contest to this election.

As soon as the official results are certified to this office by the registrar of voters for the counties of Kern and Tulare, an official Certificate of Election will be prepared for transmittal as required by law.

PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Lowenthal, the following prayer was offered by Reverend Bob Oshita:

It was in 1975 that I received my first assignment as a minister. I was assigned to the large Los Angeles Temple just outside of Little Tokyo. I still recall the first time someone said to me before a service, “You know, I’m not Buddhist.” I remember smiling as I responded, “Neither am I.” I felt, even then, that labels can separate us rather than bring us together. Especially with religion and politics, the labels we give ourselves and to others, too often divide us rather than bring us together.

In 2001, still reeling from the shock of 9-11, I was invited to participate in a truly diverse interfaith forum with 16 clergy participating. We were asked to present the essence of our traditions in 5 minutes. After one hour, we were not even halfway done. After 2 hours, I sensed the audience was growing a little weary. When the microphone finally came to me, I promised to be brief. Then shared one sentence. “If there is a religious tradition that would say, ‘If we could get beyond all religious labels and start over again and just be good and kind and decent to each other, Buddhism would be delighted.’” I handed the microphone off and was surprised by the applause.

It seems I was not alone in wanting to move away from the labels that divide us and simply feel the caring and kindness of our shared humanity. We are living in times where we need each other perhaps more than ever. We know this, and admired spiritual leaders through time have known this.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, “We argue endlessly over creeds, ritual and denominations. We must see that we have a unity of purpose that transcends our differences.”

If only we could get beyond our differences and just be good and kind and decent to each other. If only . . .

Namo Amida Butsu—Let us live with kindness and gratitude beyond words.
