There is a poem called "The Dash", which is about the life you live between your birth and your death. The dash between 1912–2006 is Jessie Rodriguez Negrete's life. She was born in 1912, in Dog Town, a neighborhood in downtown Los Angeles. The neighborhood was called Dog Town because the dog pound was across the street.

Her father came to this country in the 1890's to work on the railroads. In 1905, her mother and brothers came to this country to work on the railroads too. They lived in company housing.

Jessie was one of ten children. She and her family moved to Pacoima in the early 1920's. Her father bought a plot of land and grew their own food. Their nearest neighbor was half a mile away.

Jessie returned to the Los Angeles area at the age of seventeen and worked at various companies like the Blue Diamond Walnut Company. During the war she and my father worked at the Long Beach shipyards.

She was a very hard working woman. Employed by the same company for more than 30 years, she didn't retire until she was a little past the age of 75.

After retirement, Jessie volunteered at various places such as the Montello library, an East Los Angeles senior center near her home, and the Salvation Army in East LA where she often complained that there were so many old people. She also volunteered as a poll worker for more than 30 years. Jessie finally gave up volunteer poll work when her eyesight did not permit her to read the small print on the ballots.

Jessie leaves a marvelous legacy of determination, perseverance, hard work, devotion, and love of family that she instilled in her family.

She is survived by one sister, a brother, a remaining son, 5 daughters, grandchildren, great grandchildren, and great-great grandchildren who number 88.

Jessie Rodriguez Negrete died on Friday, March 10, 2006 at 2:45 a.m., at the age of 93, one month short of being on this earth 94 fruitful years. Jessie touched many lives along her journey through this life, and she will forever be cherished and missed by many, but none so much as by her family and her daughter.
