RE: Letter to the Journal on Assembly Bill 20 (Chapter 402, 2009)

This letter serves to clarify the legislative intent of the amendments to Assembly Bill 20 that were negotiated with the Senate Appropriations Committee staff and agreed upon by all interested parties. I accepted the amendments, and the measure was reported out of Committee with these amendments on July 15, 2009.

While Assembly Bill 20 was in the Senate Appropriations Committee, the committee staff received a fiscal estimate from the Department of General Services (DGS) that indicated the following: "Fees and costs for meeting to develop model terms: facilitation \$25,000, support staff (.4) PY \$40,000." In order to negate the fiscal costs estimated by DGS, the bill was amended to clarify that the University of California (UC) and the California State University (CSU) would be responsible for facilitating and hosting the meetings and would provide appropriate support (i.e., typing of meeting minutes, disseminating drafts and agendas) for the implementation of Assembly Bill 20.

It was my intent that UC and CSU provide the appropriate clerical support necessary for the facilitation of the meetings that are required by Assembly Bill 20 and would host the meetings. Each of the segments would then absorb their own internal costs, as the potential for future cost savings from the agreed upon standardized terms far outweigh the initial costs incurred by the DGS, CSU and UC.

I hope this clarifies the intent of the July 15, 2009 amendment taken in the Senate Appropriations Committee.
