PRAYER

Upon invitation of Assistant Speaker pro Tempore Friedman, the following prayer was offered by Assembly Chaplain Rev. Bob Oshita:

In Post-War America of the late 1940s and '50s, my parents taught their four children with how they lived each day—and with many firm "conversations," that we must always behave well. Both Mom and Dad were raised in Japan, and returned to the country of their birth before the War, so their first language was Japanese. If we were acting out or speaking too loudly in public (as children often do), they would quietly say to us, "ii-kage-ni-shinasai . . . " With Mom and Dad, the more gently they spoke, the more weight their words carried. And when they spoke in Japanese, we knew it was a no-nonsense message.

"ii-kage-ni-shinasai" literally means "cast a good shadow." The image was unmistakable; our behavior and our actions would cast a shadow that would reflect not only on our family, but our entire community of Japanese-Americans. From a very young age, we unconsciously knew we were Ambassadors, representing how all Japanese might be judged by a country still considering us Enemy-Aliens. Every Nisei and Sansei (2nd and 3rd generation Japanese-American) knows this to be true.

I know now that we are all Ambassadors on many levels. When we travel abroad or encounter foreign visitors here at home, to the people we meet, we represent our nation's amazing diversity and way of life.

Each time my wife, Patti, and I have traveled abroad, wherever we have encountered the kindness of strangers, a feeling remained in our hearts. The feeling was this, "We could live here." It is easy to imagine living wherever there is Human Kindness.

We are all Ambassadors in so many ways. It is an honor to represent our families, our cities, our state, and our nation. Let us all try to "cast a good shadow" and become living embodiments of Human Kindness.
