In 1951, 75 years ago, this month, a play opened on Broadway. It was based on a novel written in 1940 by Margaret Landon. Five years later, in 1956, it was made into a movie.

This musical continues to, not just entertain us, but reminds us that, if we try, we can learn from one another. It reminds us that we can respectfully disagree and still laugh together. This play gives me hope that maybe we can all come to a place of mutual respect and understanding. All we have to do is try.
