Members of the Assembly: As required by the California Government Code, Section 8542, et. seq., the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning our review of the State of California's internal controls and compliance with state and federal laws and regulations for the year ended June 30, 1999.

This report shows that in some instances the State has not established an effective system of internal control over financial reporting and compliance with federal requirements. Additionally, it does not always adhere to established control procedures. These problems result in noncompliance with some state and federal regulations. Although none of the problems we identified is significant to the State's financial statements or the federal programs it administers, weaknesses in the State's internal control system could adversely affect its ability to provide accurate financial information and to administer federal programs in compliance with applicable requirements.

Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning the California Public Utilities Commission (commission).

This report concludes that the commission does not adequately develop and manage its contracts. For example, it sometimes fails to perform important steps in developing its contracts, such as seeking competitive bids, including a clearly defined scope of work, and preparing reasonably detailed budgets and progress schedules. It also does not always review its consultants' invoices to make sure that the charges are appropriate and sufficiently supported. As a result, the commission has made hundreds of thousands of dollars in questionable payments to its consultants.
