Legislative Intent—Assembly Bill No. 1695

April 3, 2002

The Honorable Herb Wesson, Jr. Speaker of the Assembly State Capitol Sacramento, California

Dear Speaker Wesson: This letter is being sent for publication in the journal.

Last year, the Legislature passed and the Governor signed AB 1695 (Chapter 653, Statutes of 2001) as an urgency measure. AB 1695 primarily related to the placement of children in foster care with relative caregivers. However, as part of that legislation, Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC) section 361.5(b)(10) was amended in response to the State Supreme Court's ruling in *Renee J. v. Superior Court* (2001) 26 Cal.4th 735. The Supreme Court's interpretation of this section in the *Renee J.* case did not reflect the Legislature's meaning in crafting the statute. Therefore, our purpose in rewriting WIC section 361.5(b)(10) was to make clear the Legislature's original intent in establishing this section of law, not to establish a new meaning.

Dear Dotson,

Today I cast an "aye" vote on File Item 21 / Senate Bill 1227 (Burton), commonly known as the housing bond bill. This vote merits explanation.

I'd like the record to reflect that I am personally opposed to this bill and under other, more normal circumstances would have cast a "no" vote on this measure as bad policy for California.

Today was not reflective of normal circumstances. One of our colleagues, Assembly Member Gil Cedillo, could not be with us. Had he been, he would have been the deciding vote in the passage of SB 1227 and I could have pressed the red button at my desk. However, Mr. Cedillo is dealing with devastating, tragic family issues and has properly chosen to remain at home today. Few of us can begin to understand the anguish he must be experiencing in helping his family and wife face her most grave illness.

Often Gil Cedillo and I disagree on policy matters as would have been the case today. Nonetheless, as a representative of his constituents, as a man, a father and loving husband, I hold him in the highest esteem for maintaining his life's priorities to remain at her side.

As a consequence, I could not sit by and let the political calendar of our Legislature capitalize on the unthinkable misfortune that has befallen Assembly Member Cedillo and his wife. My vote today was a courtesy vote offered on his behalf. Should the Governor sign this measure, I trust the people of this State to decide its fate based upon its merits.

My thoughts and prayers are with the Cedillo family.
