PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Campos, the following prayer was offered by Guest Chaplain Father Mesrop Ash, of St. John's Armenian Church in San Francisco:

Almighty Lord, Gathered here today in the State Capitol are individuals elected by their peers to serve the people of California. By God's will, may they have the strength and fortitude to be good stewards of the land and people that they have been entrusted with.

Today, we are joined in offering our sincere prayers for the souls of the victims of the first genocide of the 20th Century, perpetrated by the Ottoman Empire against the Armenian people.

You God, are a lover of Mankind and the hope of the just. We acknowledge today that unpunished crimes beget further crimes. As the Armenian Genocide remains unacknowledged by the descendents of its perpetrators, we remember with lamenting hearts the victims of the subsequent genocides, which have plagued humanity throughout the 20th Century: the Holocaust, Cambodia, Rwanda, and the Sudan.

Through the elected servants present here today, Lord, we give thanks for the defenders of justice who courageously stand boldly proclaiming the truth of the past, for the sake of humanity. The Californians they represent, and especially the Armenian-Americans, render all due respect to the Great State of California and its leaders in their efforts to uphold the sanctity of human life by solemnly commemorating the 99th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide.

As we quickly approach the centennial anniversary of the Armenian Genocide, we are painfully aware that while a century has passed since the forebearers of the Armenian people faced intolerable hate-fueled cruelty, much of humanity still remains subject to the ways of violent and unjust men.

We offer our prayers, oh Lord, for all of those who continue to suffer in the throes of the fog of war and conflict. We especially remember the communities of Aleppo and Kessab in Syria, where the Armenians sought refuge from genocide almost 100 years ago, and today have become the battlegrounds of a bloody Civil War, thereby displacing thousands of innocent families. Remember them as we ask for justice and peace through prayer today.

As the Universe testifies to the beauty of Your Creation, so we pray that this moment and the proclamation of the State of California testify to the truth of history.

It is our ultimate prayer that we should all, through the love and grace of God, find the strength to engage both our history and future with sincere boldness and brave honesty.—AMEN.
