Members of the Assembly: The Bureau of State Audits presents its Independent Auditor's Report on the State of California's basic financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2007. These financial statements are presented on a basis in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The financial statements show that the State's General fund had revenues and other financing sources that were approximately \$4.6 billion less than expenditures and other financing uses. The General Fund ended the fiscal year with a fund deficit of approximately \$1.9 billion. The GAAP basis government-wide statements include all liabilities owed by the State while the budgetary basis statements that are used to report on the State's budget do not reflect all liabilities.

We conducted the audit to comply with the California Government Code 8546.4.

Members of the Assembly: Pursuant to the California Whistleblower Protection Act, the Bureau of State Audits presents its investigative report summarizing investigations of improper governmental activity completed from July through December 2007.

This report details seven substantiated allegations in state departments and universities. Through our investigative methods, we found waste, mismanagement, and misuse of state funds and resources, wasteful economic decisions, and failure to take appropriate action. For example, the Department of Justice (Justice) created inefficiency by entering into a series of side letters that were negotiated directly with a bargaining unit, rather than using the formal approval and ratification process. As a result, Justice absorbed the salaries and benefits of four employees who were released from work full-time over a 12-year span to participate in union-related activities at a cost of \$2.4 million.

In addition, this report provides an update on previously reported issues and describes any additional actions taken by state departments to correct the problems we previously identified. For example, the California Highway Patrol placed 51 vans into service in November 2007 after it had purchased and left them virtually unused for more than two years.
