ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3—Richman. An act to add Section 24201.5 to, and to add Part 15 (commencing with Section 29000) to Division 1 of Title 1 of, the Education Code, and to amend Sections 20133, 20814, 20816, 31453, 31453.5, 31592.2, 31720, 31723, 31724, 31727.4, 31729, 31730, and 31731 of, to add Sections 20695, 21150.5, 21352.5, 21403, 31481, and 31624 to, to add Part 3.6 (commencing with Section 21800) to Division 5 of Title 2 of, to add Part 9 (commencing with Section 22980) to Division 5 of Title 2 of, and to repeal Sections 20820 and 31592.4 of, the Government Code, and to add Section 4666 to the Labor Code, relating to retirement, and making an appropriation therefor.

ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 8—Richman. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, by adding Section 8 to Article XX thereof, relating to public pension or retirement benefits.
