Without objection, Assembly Member Núñez was granted unanimous consent that Frank Rothman's address be printed in the Journal:

Good afternoon.

Every survivor has their own story to tell. Mine started when Germany occupied Hungary, and I saw with my own eyes when Nazi troops entered our city.

It was a day I will never forget. It was the beginning to our tragic end. It was a day I will never forget. It changed my life forever.

Right away on the outskirts of our city, around an open field, fences were erected and a ghetto was built in a hurry. Then one day, large posters were hung on every street corner indicating that all Jews had to be outside their homes on the sidewalk at seven o'clock in the morning. Anybody disobeying the order would be shot.

All the Jews, men, women and children were rounded up and taken to the newly built ghetto. We spent five miserable weeks there. Then the big blow came. The Nazis decided to empty the ghetto.

In a group of two thousand, we were herded to the railroad station where cattle cars were waiting for us. They pushed us into the cattle cars without giving us any food or water. After the cattle cars were locked, we began to move.

The journey to our destruction began. Our destination was the infamous concentration camp "Auschwitz", which was in Poland, a place especially built to kill people.

After three nights and three days our nightmarish trip was over. We arrived at Auschwitz.

They pushed us out of the cattle cars, a so called selection took place which meant that some young people were ordered to step aside. The rest, men, women, and children were taken directly to the gas chambers and crematoriums. Within a few hours, only their ashes remained.

I lost that morning my beloved Mother, my beloved Father, 2 sisters, one was only 11 years old. They also killed all my uncles, all my aunts, some cousins. Even my 90-year old grandmother was not spared. She too was pushed into the gas chamber and then burned. So started my first day at Auschwitz.

We who were not taken to the gas chamber became slaves. We had to work 12–14 hours a day with little food. Hunger, beatings, torture, humiliation were part of our everyday life. The Nazis committed crimes of such a magnitude that no sane person can grasp it.

We who were at Auschwitz never believed that we would survive. We knew we too would eventually end up in the ovens or the crematoriums. Our biggest fear was that the world would never know what happened to us.

But a few of us with luck did survive.

Now it is our solemn obligation to keep the memories of those dark years alive. We owe this to the millions who were killed, the millions slaughtered in the Holocaust.

It is our duty to remember and honor them.

We must also teach our children, grandchildren, the new generation to fight discrimination, bigotry and hatred, so that similar tragedies won't happen in their lifetime. Let the Holocaust be a constant reminder what evil men can do if we allow them to be in power.

Now I want to express my deep gratitude to you members of the Assembly for carrying the Torch of Remembrance. The flame of this Torch shall never be extinguished. It is a noble task you are performing.

In the name of all survivors here, I salute you.

We are the last living survivors, the last witnesses to the Holocaust.

Many years have passed since the liberation, yet we remain as prisoners trapped in our tragic past. We still grieve, our wounds never healed and we will carry the awful memories of those dark years to our graves.

I hope and pray that future generations will be spared what we had to endure.

May you have Shalom, which in Hebrew means peace.
