Dear Ms. Boyer-Vine, Ms. Contreras, and Ms. Parker:

Due to the State of Emergency declared by the Governor on March 4, 2020 as a result of the threat of COVID-19 and the unique circumstances caused by this pandemic, I write to request the temporary suspension of provisions that require state entities to submit reports to the Legislature.
