Members of the Assembly: The Bureau of State Audits presents its Independent Auditor's Report on the State of California's basic financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2005. These financial statements are presented on a basis in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The financial statements show that the State's General Fund had revenues and other financing sources that were approximately \$1.7 billion more than expenditures and other financing uses. The General Fund ended the fiscal year with a fund balance of approximately \$187 million. The GAAP basis government-wide statements include all liabilities owed by the State while the budgetary basis statements that are used to report on the State's budget do not reflect all liabilities.

We conducted the audit to comply with the California Government Code, Section 8546.4.
