PRAYER

Upon invitation of Assistant Speaker pro Tempore Baca, the following prayer was offered by Rabbi Marvin Schwab of the Sunrise Jewish Congregation:

Fifty years ago, I couldn't make the statement that I'm about to make to you. An airplane will land in Israel today. Fifty years ago, there was no state of Israel. The remarkable thing about this particular airplane is that it's carrying high school students from California. They are not flying from California to Israel, but they are on what is called the "March of the Living," an ultimate statement of hope, and renewal, and rebirth. As spring is the time of rebirth, so they go in the spring. And they go, and they tour the places in Poland where Jews were slaughtered during the Holocaust. And we survived. And in triumph, they arrived in the Jewish homeland, the state of Israel. It is a democracy, the only one in the Middle East. There is a linkage between Israel and this country that runs very deep. The year that I lived in Jerusalem, I lived on Rechov Avraham Lincoln. Translation: Abraham Lincoln Street. And now I'm privileged to stand beneath a portrait of Abraham Lincoln and pray on behalf of all of us, that this state and this country will always, always be symbolic of the message of the Jewish festival of Passover, which concluded recently, that none be slaves and none be masters. Eloheinu veilohei avoteinu v'imotenu. Our God and God of our ancestors, we ask that You pour upon this Assembly Ruach Chochma, the spirit of wisdom. Guide their decisions, guide their legislation that it will benefit all of us. That we may live together always in peace and freedom and security, each giving the other the freedom to worship, the freedom to pursue happiness as we each seek to be proper in the eyes of God.—AMEN.
