PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Lieber, the following prayer was offered by Rabbi Nathaniel Ezray, Temple Beth Jacob in Redwood City:

Invocation for Yom HaShoah

On this day, we gather to commemorate the unfathomable. You HaShoah is the official day of mourning and memorial for the victims of the Holocaust. How can any commemoration capture that which is so horrific, so incomprehensible, so overwhelming?

It can't.

Words are inadequate. No author can capture its evil. No philosopher can analyze its reality. No Rabbi can express its emotions. I stand before you lacking words, and of uncertain faith—yet aware that our souls cry out to respond somehow.

The beginning of response is memory. There is an imperative to remember, for in memory we begin to find the sparks of illumination amidst darkness. So today I ask you to embrace the imperative—z'chor—remember:

Memory allows us to tell the stories of those who have been torn away from us. In lifting up their stories, their dreams, their pain and taking them into our hearts, they begin to transform from an anonymous number to a sacred human with a precious legacy.

Memory connects us to the courageous and important stories of those who survived. We learn from them. We honor them as we share their pain. Their stories are holy.

Memory creates a dynamic where we explore and learn from the variety of historic realities: Jewish spiritual and physical resistance, righteous gentiles who risked their lives to save Jews, apathy amongst our allies, lost communities. So much is revealed when we access memory.

Memory demands that we confront the political and social conditions that resulted in this terrible moment of human history. As we remember the failure of law, education, science and religion in Nazi Europe, we respond by creating conditions where the dignity of each individual is safeguarded.

We respond with vigilance and activism. When we see racism, prejudice, oppression, genocide—we make by the words, "Never Again!" the touchstone whereby we order our lives. Encounter with memory drives home the truth of Eli Wiesel that "Whenever a community is threatened, all are affected. Whenever a single human being is humiliated, the human image is cheapened. Whenever a person suffers . . . and no one is there to offer a hand . . . something is wrong with society." Memory motivates engagement with social and political realities.

On this day of sacred memory, Yom HaShoah, we declare our faith. We will remember. We will let those memories touch us. We will let those memories inspire us and in so doing we give honor to those who are no longer with us. May their memories endure as a blessing.—AMEN.
