PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker Pérez, the following prayer was offered by Guest Chaplain Rabbi Susan Leider, Senior Rabbi of the Congregation Kol Shofar in Tiburon:

In Budapest, Hungary, there is a silvery willow tree, a traditional symbol of mourning. On each leaf of the silvery tree, there is one name of a man, a woman, a boy or a girl who was murdered in the Holocaust. This tree is placed in a courtyard in the Raoul Wallenberg Memorial Park in Budapest.

Raoul Wallenberg was a Swedish diplomat who saved many Jews in the Holocaust. Like the light on the silver leaves of that tree, he was a ray of light in a world of darkness, and his acts of courage saved many lives.

O, God, Ruler of the Universe, like Raoul Wallenberg, we strive to bring light into the world. Today, we gather to remember the souls of our brothers and sisters—men, women, and children who were slaughtered and who have gone on to their eternal home. May our solemn assembly now in these chambers be our sacred way to remember them and to cause the memory of their lives to live on forever.

Although we ask, "Can there be light in darkness? Can there be any light in the world?", we know that our answer must be filled with light, a decisive response of life. Like the leaves on the silver memorial tree in Budapest, our acts can bring light to the world, even when there is darkness. You are the Assembly men and women who labor on behalf of the citizens of the State of California to bring light to the entire United States and to the world.

May the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable to You, our Rock and our Redeemer. May the One who brings peace to God's universe bring peace to us, to all of Israel, and to all who dwell on Earth.—Let us say, AMEN.
