The following veto message from the Governor was received and ordered printed in the Journal and the bill ordered to the unfinished business file:

Veto Message—Assembly Bill No. 626

Governor's Office, Sacramento May 5, 1998

To the Members of the California Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill No. 626 without my signature.

This bill would require local governments, by January 1, 2000, to adopt veterans' preference systems that would give preference to a veteran over an equally qualified candidate, or to pass a resolution stating the reasons that they do not implement such preferences.

Although this bill has a laudable intent, it is unnecessary. Local governments already have the authority to implement veterans' preferences within their employment practices. Further, if veterans would like to see such preferences implemented they can, at any time, go before a county's governing board and publicly request such actions. At that time, their locally elected officials can and should decide if a veterans' preference in their employment practices is appropriate in their community—as I would hope and urge them to do. Veterans

deserve preference for their service in my judgment, but the state should not usurp what is clearly a local policy decision.
