MESSAGES FROM THE ACTING GOVERNOR

The following message from the Acting Governor was received and ordered printed in the Journal:

PROCLAMATION

Cinco de Mayo

- WHEREAS, Cinco de Mayo, or the Fifth of May, commemorates the defeat of the French army by the Mexican army at the Battle of Puebla in 1862; and
- WHEREAS, the battle at Puebla in 1862 happened at a violent and chaotic time in Mexico's history. After Mexico won its independence from Spain in 1810, it faced internal power struggles that left it in a state of instability and rebellion for years. During this period, Mexico accumulated heavy debts to several nations,

including France which was demanding payment. Mexican President Juarez Benito issued a moratorium suspending all foreign debt payments for a brief period; and

- WHEREAS, France refused to allow President Juarez to do this and invaded Mexico, determined to get payment by whatever means. Napoleon decided to establish his own leadership in Mexico by installing French Archduke Maximilian as ruler. Although American President Abraham Lincoln was sympathetic to Mexico's cause, the United States was involved in its own Civil War at the time and unable to provide assistance; and
- WHEREAS, When, in 1862, the French army began its advance, Mexican General Ignacio Zaragoza led 5,000 Mestizo and Zapotec Indians who defeated the French army under General Lorencez. The following year, however, the French captured Puebla and ruled Mexico. In 1865, at the end of the American Civil War, President Lincoln demanded that the French troops withdraw from Mexico or American troops would be sent to fight on the side of Mexico. Two years later, the last French troops left Mexico and European armies were never again to invade the Americas; and
- WHEREAS, Cinco de Mayo not only commemorates the courageous victory of the Mexican troops, it also celebrates the patriotism of Mexicans and symbolizes the right of people to self determination and national sovereignty. Cinco de Mayo reminds us of the solidarity between the people of Mexico and the people of the United States; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that I, Cruz M. Bustamante, Acting Governor of the State of California, do hereby call on the people of California to join the people of Mexico in celebrating Cinco de Mayo as a defining moment in Mexican history and for encouraging close cultural ties between Mexico and California, home to a large number of Americans of Mexican descent.
