Members of the Assembly: As requested by the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, the Bureau of State Audits presents its audit report concerning our review of the Department of Health Services' (Health Services) practices for containing Medical Assistance Program (Medi-Cal) pharmaceutical costs. This report concludes that Health Services may not fully achieve the roughly \$104 million cost savings to the State's General Fund that it predicted for fiscal years 2002–03 and 2003–04. Health Services' inability to generate the full savings stems from a lack of pharmacists, a failure to consider fully the consequences of some of its planned activities, and a lack of reliable data to support its estimates. Further, although it appears that California was one of the first states to use cost-saving strategies, such as its List of Contract Drugs and pursuit of supplemental rebates to contain prescription drug costs, Health Services has not adopted certain techniques other states use. For example, some states use disease management programs or target their educational efforts toward providers whose prescribing or dispensing patterns are inappropriate. Finally, Health Services may be able to achieve additional savings of up to \$80 million by eliminating optional pharmacy benefits.
