Please join me in a moment of reflection.

It was about 20 years ago, that I was inspired to reexamine my perspective on how I unconsciously viewed age. It must have been around 1998 that I was moved by a documentary on Alfredo Salce Torres: artist, sculptor, muralist, teacher, and mentor. He was a contemporary of the well-known Diego Rivera; but in his lifetime, he was considered the most important living Mexican Artist.

Not one seeking accolades or requiring personal validation, it is said he turned down Mexico's coveted National Prize for Arts and Sciences a number of times, finally accepting at the age of 93. That interview with Alfredo Salce Torres, so vividly revealed that his creative vitality and gentle humor remained vibrant at the age of 90. When he was asked, "Is there anything you would wish for?" Without hesitation, he said, "I wish I could be 80 again! I had so much more energy when I was 80!"

I recall him gently laughing, but he was also making a meaningful point. However old we may be (or become), a part of us will always wish we could be 10 years younger. He changed my view of aging. From that moment, I began to embrace the days of my life, as a dream I would wish for 10 years from now. In other words, this day and age we are living, this moment, right now, is a "wish" come true—a "wish" our future selves will long for, but can never have. Alfredo Salce Torres died at the age of 95 in 2003, but I will always remain grateful for his inspiration to live each day as a dream come true.
