**INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF
ASSEMBLY BILLS**

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1—Cardoza (Coauthors: Calderon, Cohn, Diaz, Firebaugh, Matthews, Nakano, and Thomson). An act to add Article 9 (commencing with Section 22200) to Chapter 1 of Part 5 of Division 11 of the Water Code, relating to energy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2—Corbett (Principal coauthor: Wiggins) (Coauthors: Alquist, Aroner, Cardenas, Cedillo, Cohn, Firebaugh, Goldberg, Jackson, Keeley, Koretz, Lowenthal, Migden, Oropeza, Pavley, Shelley, Steinberg, Strom-Martin, Thomson, and Vargas). An act to add and repeal Part 12 (commencing with Section 28001) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3—Simitian. An act to add and repeal Section 2774.7 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 4—Cardoza (Coauthors: Cohn, Frommer, Reyes, and Salinas) (Coauthor: Senator Romero). An act to add Section 2774.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electric power, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 5—Kelley. An act to add Section 739.9 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 6—Kelley. An act to add Section 13193.9 to the Water Code, relating to water.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 7—Simitian. An act to add Section 454.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 8—Simitian. An act to add and repeal Section 2774.7 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 9—Migden. An act to amend Sections 331, 366, and 381 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
