# INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ASSEMBLY BILLS

The following bills were introduced and read the first time:

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 1—Cardoza (Coauthors: Calderon, Cohn, Diaz, Firebaugh, Matthews, Nakano, and Thomson). An act to add Article 9 (commencing with Section 22200) to Chapter 1 of Part 5 of Division 11 of the Water Code, relating to energy.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2—Corbett (Principal coauthor: Wiggins) (Coauthors: Alquist, Aroner, Cardenas, Cedillo, Cohn, Firebaugh, Goldberg, Jackson, Keeley, Koretz, Lowenthal, Migden, Oropeza, Pavley, Shelley, Steinberg, Strom-Martin, Thomson, and Vargas). An act to add and repeal Part 12 (commencing with Section 28001) of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3—Simitian.** An act to add and repeal Section 2774.7 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 4—Cardoza (Coauthors: Cohn, Frommer, Reyes, and Salinas) (Coauthor: Senator Romero). An act to add Section 2774.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to electric power, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 5—Kelley.** An act to add Section 739.9 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 6—Kelley.** An act to add Section 13193.9 to the Water Code, relating to water.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 7—Simitian.** An act to add Section 454.5 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 8—Simitian.** An act to add and repeal Section 2774.7 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 9—Migden.** An act to amend Sections 331, 366, and 381 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
