**PRAYER**

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Mullin, the following prayer was offered by Assembly Member Shirley N. Weber, of the 79th Assembly District:

*Father*, When I visit the friend of many years, chief, the Nana, in Kumasi, I am asked only one question: “Sister Shirley, how are the children?” This question speaks to the heart of a leader because the true worth of the chief is how well the children are faring. This demonstrates whether the village will survive; maintains its traditions and values; and contributes to the well-being of the country. The role of the leader is to make sure the children are safe, physically and mentally.

Father, if asked this question, we must admit that we witnessed another shooting of our children in our schools. Not at the hands of foreigners, but violence from within.

Thus, in 2018 we have seen 27 violent acts in our schools and there have not been 27 weeks in this year. In the past 9 years, we have witnessed 288 school shootings, the largest in the world. And the country with the second highest incidents, Mexico, had only 8. We have had more deaths in our schools this year than deaths among our men in uniform around the world—and our schools are not supposed to be war zones.

And so we leaders continue to debate the issue, making sure we blame someone other than ourselves. Meanwhile, as the African proverb says, “When two elephants fight, it is the grass that suffers.” Our children, the grass, are the victims of our debates and inactions.

Let us pray that we will sincerely address this issue in this state and nation, making sure that the well-being of our children is central to our mission and reflected in our work.

It is my prayer that when I travel to Kumasi and see the Nana and he asks the question, “Sister Shirley, how are the children?” I can say proudly and honestly, “Nana, they are well.”—AMEN.

RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Bargaining Unit (BU) 6, the California Correctional Peace Officers Association (CCPOA)

Dear Senators Atkins and Bates, and Assembly Members Rendon and Dahle: Recently, the California Department of Human Resources reached a new Tentative Agreement/MOU with the union representing BU 6, CCPOA. Upon approval of the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by the membership, this agreement will be effective July 3, 2018 through July 2, 2019.

This agreement will roll over language from past agreements and the attached summary highlights provisions with significant changes. In addition, members will receive a five (5%) percent General Salary Increase, effective July 1, 2019.

In accordance with Government Code sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, I am forwarding copies of this Tentative Agreement/MOU, including legislative and fiscal summaries. The Legislative Analyst will be forwarded a copy for analysis, and the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the Assembly will be forwarded copies to note them as available for review in the daily journals.
