An act to amend Section 1005.5 of, to add Section 1012 to, and to add and repeal Article 6 (commencing with Section 1125) of Chapter 5 of Part 1 of Division 1 of, the Public Utilities Code, relating to gas pipelines, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 48—Wright. An act to amend Section 25550 of, and to add Sections 25137 and 25551 to, the Public Resources Code, relating to electrical energy, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 49—Dickerson. An act to add Section 2771.1 to the Public Utilities Code, relating to public utilities, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
