Dear Mr. Wilson,

This letter is to clarify the authors' intent of AB 2473, Chapter 789, Statute of 2004.

AB 2473 was introduced to define reasonable restrictions for solar energy systems which would create a middle ground between disallowing their use altogether, and allowing any and all system installations. Existing law permits reasonable restrictions on a solar energy system that do not "significantly," as defined, increase the cost of the system or decrease its efficiency or specified performance. AB 2473 redefined the term "significantly," amending Section 714(d) of the Civil Code to read:

"(1)(A) For solar domestic water heating systems or solar swimming pool heating systems that comply with state and federal law, "significantly" means an amount exceeding 20 percent of the cost of the system or decreasing the efficiency of the solar energy system by an amount exceeding 20 percent, as originally specified and proposed.

(B) For photovoltaic systems that comply with state and federal law, "significantly" means an amount not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) over the system cost as originally specified and proposed, or a decrease in system efficiency of an amount exceeding 20 percent as originally specified and proposed." Section 714 of the Civil Code was originally signed into law to be primarily applicable to Home Owner Associations, and my intention was that the same applicability remain in the law as amended by AB 2473. AB 2473 further requires cities and counties to administratively approve applications to install solar energy systems by issuing building permits or similar nondiscretionary permits. Local building officials may require 'use permits' if they have a good faith belief that there is a specific, adverse public health and safety impact resulting from the use of solar energy systems as defined.

The intent of this letter is to provide guidance to local jurisdictions, which are responsible for the implementation and oversight of AB 2473, to ensure that its implementation reflects the true intent and spirit of this important new law.
