**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 60—Hollingsworth and Daucher.** An act to add Article 1.7 (commencing with Section 41775) to Chapter 3 of Part 4 of Division 26 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to air pollution, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.
