## USE TAX COLLECTION (A.B. 2412)—#10248

Dear Ms. Migden: You have asked us to discuss the impact Assembly Bill No. 2412 of the 1999–2000 Regular Session, as amended on May 15, 2000, would have, if enacted, upon current law; whether the passage of that bill requires the approval of two-thirds of each house of the Legislature; and whether that bill constitutes a tax levy within the meaning of the California Constitution.

Assembly Bill No. 2412 of the 1999–2000 Regular Session, as amended May 15, 2000 (hereafter A.B. 2412), would amend Section 6203 of the Revenue and Taxation Code,<sup>1</sup> which currently requires each retailer "engaged in business in this state" to collect use tax with respect to a purchase of tangible personal property "for storage, use, or other consumption in this state" (subd. (a), Sec. 6203).

By way of background, the Sales and Use Tax Law (Pt. 1 (commencing with Sec. 6001), Div. 2) provides for the imposition and

collection of two separate and distinct taxes: a sales tax (Secs. 6051, 6051.2, 6051.3, and 6051.4) and a use tax (Secs. 6201, 6201.2, 6201.3, and 6201.4).

The sales tax is imposed on retailers for the privilege of selling tangible personal property at retail in this state and is measured by the gross receipts of retailers derived from those sales (Sec. 6051; *Bigsby* v. *Johnson* (1941) 18 Cal.2d 860, 862–863). Even though a retailer collects the tax from the consumer insofar as it can be done (Sec. 6052), the tax is a direct obligation of the retailer and, as far as the customer is concerned, it is a part of the price paid for goods and nothing else (*Western L. Co. v. State Bd. of Equalization* (1938) 11 Cal.2d 156, 164).

In contrast, the use tax is an excise tax on the privilege of utilizing tangible personal property in this state (Sec. 6201; *Union Oil Co.* v. *State Bd. of Equal.* (1963) 60 Cal.2d 441, 452). In *Brandtjen and Kluge* v. *Fincher* (1941) 44 Cal.App.2d Supp. 939, at page 942, the court had the following to say concerning the purposes of the use tax:

"... One of the purposes of the Use Tax Act is to help retailers in the state, who are subject to the sales tax, to compete on terms of equality with retailers out of the state who are exempt from the sales tax. This purpose could not be fully accomplished by imposing the direct liability for the use tax on the retailer, who would in many cases be outside of the state and not subject to its laws at all. It can be carried out by levying the tax on the purchaser who brings the property into this state for use. Accordingly . . . the Use Tax Act imposes the tax, not on 'the privilege of selling tangible personal property,' as does the Sales Tax Act, but on the 'storage, use or other consumption' of such property in the state, and makes the purchaser, not the seller, liable for the tax." (Citations omitted.)

Thus, while the sales tax is an obligation of the retailer (*Western L. Co. v. State Bd. of Equalization*, supra, at p. 164), the purchaser is primarily liable for the use tax (*Brandtjen and Kluge v. Fincher*, supra, at p. 943). However, the Sales and Use Tax Law generally requires the collection of the use tax from purchasers by retailers "engaged in business in this state" (Sec. 6203). For purposes of this requirement, Section 6203 defines a "retailer engaged in business in this state," in pertinent part, as follows:

"6203. . . .

\* \* \*

"(c) 'Retailer engaged in business in this state' as used in this section and Section 6202 means and includes any of the following:

"(1) Any retailer maintaining, occupying, or using, permanently or temporarily, directly or indirectly, or through a subsidiary, or agent, by whatever name called, an office, place of distribution, sales or sample room or place, warehouse or storage place, or other place of business.

"(2) Any retailer having any representative, agent, salesperson, canvasser, independent contractor, or solicitor operating in this state under the authority of the retailer or its subsidiary for the purpose of selling, delivering, installing,

assembling, or the taking of orders for any tangible personal property.

"(3) As respects a lease, any retailer deriving rentals from a lease of tangible personal property situated in this state.

"(4) (A) Any retailer soliciting orders for tangible personal property by mail if the solicitations are substantial and recurring and if the retailer benefits from any banking, financing, debt collection, telecommunication, or marketing activities occurring in this state or benefits from the location in this state of authorized installation, servicing, or repair facilities.

"(B) This paragraph shall become operative upon the enactment of any congressional act that authorizes states to compel the collection of state sales and use taxes by out-of-state retailers.

"(5) Notwithstanding Section 7262, a retailer specified in paragraph (4) above, and not specified in paragraph (1), (2), or (3) above, is a 'retailer engaged in business in this state' for the purposes of this part and Part 1.5 (commencing with Section 7200) only.

"(d) (1) For purposes of this section, 'engaged in business in this state' does not include the taking of orders from customers in this state through a computer telecommunications network located in this state which is not directly or indirectly owned by the retailer when the orders result from the electronic display of products on that same network. The exclusion provided by this subdivision shall apply only to a computer telecommunications network that consists substantially of online communications services other than the displaying and taking of orders for products.

"(2) This subdivision shall become inoperative upon the operative date of provisions of a congressional act that authorize states to compel the collection of state sales and use taxes by out-of-state retailers.

"(e) Except as provided in this subdivision, a retailer is not a 'retailer engaged in business in this state' under paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) if that retailer's sole physical presence in this state is to engage in convention and trade show activities as described in Section 513(d)(3)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code, and if the retailer, including any of his or her representatives, agents, salespersons, canvassers, independent contractors, or solicitors, does not engage in those convention and trade show activities for more than seven days, in whole or in part, in this state during any 12-month period and did not derive more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) of gross income from those activities in this state during the prior calendar year. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, a retailer engaging in convention and trade show activities, as described in Section 513(d)(3)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code, is a 'retailer engaged in business in this state,' and is liable for collection of the applicable use tax, with respect to any sale

of tangible personal property occurring at the convention and trade show activities and with respect to any sale of tangible personal property made pursuant to an order taken at or during those convention and trade show activities.

"(f) The Legislature finds and declares that the deletion of language by the act adding this subdivision that was contained in paragraphs (5) and (8) of subdivision (c) is intended to codify the holdings of recent court cases."

Furthermore, the courts have described the fundamental nature of a retailer's duty to collect use tax as follows:

" 'The liability of the retailer is not . . . for the use tax itself but for an *amount equivalent* to it because of his default in his duty as collection agent. The taxpayer is the person ultimately liable for the tax itself, and not the person who pays the tax liability. [Citation omitted.] . . . the retailer is merely paying the debt of another when he pays the purchaser's tax, and as such stands in a position analogous to that of a surety for the purchaser so as to entitle him to reimbursement. Accordingly, the liability of the retailer under section 6204, by virtue of its wording and as construed by the cases, is for a debt rather than for taxes.' "(*Montgomery Ward & Co. v. State Bd. of Equalization* (1969) 272 Cal.App.2d 728,743; citation omitted.)

Notwithstanding the breadth of a retailer's duty under state law to collect use tax, the United States Supreme Court has indicated in *Quill* Corp. v. North Dakota (1992) 119 L.Ed.2d 91 (hereafter Quill) that the commerce clause of the United States Constitution (cl. 3, Sec. 8, Art. I, U.S. Const.) precludes a state from requiring an out-of-state seller to collect and remit the use tax of that state unless, among other things, both of the following apply: (1) the tax is applied to an activity with a substantial nexus with the taxing state, and (2) the tax is fairly related to the services provided by the state (Quill, supra, at pp. 105-106). Moreover, with respect to the first of these criteria, the United States Supreme Court has concluded that a seller's activities do not have a "substantial nexus" with a taxing state unless that seller has some sort of physical presence in the taxing state (Quill, supra, at pp. 105–106, 110). Thus, notwithstanding the expansive definition of a "retailer engaged in business in this state" that is set forth in Section 6203, Quill stands for the proposition that a taxing state cannot compel an out-of-state seller to collect and remit an amount of use tax unless the circumstances of the levy of that particular amount of tax meet certain criteria as to the proper reach of a state's taxing authority (see *Quill*, supra, at p. 107).

A.B. 2412 would amend Section 6203 to add a subdivision (g) to establish, in the context of the electronic ordering of goods from that retailer and the use by that retailer of related business entities, a presumption that a retail seller is "engaged in business in this state." Proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203 reads as follows:

"(g) (1) The processing of orders electronically, by fax, telephone, the Internet, or other electronic ordering process, does not relieve a retailer of responsibility for collection of

the tax from the purchaser if the retailer is engaged in business in this state pursuant to this section.

"(2) For purposes of this section, a retailer is presumed to have an agent within the state, as defined in paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (c), if both of the following conditions exist:

"(A) The retailer holds a substantial ownership interest, directly or through a subsidiary, in a retailer maintaining sales locations in California or is owned in whole or in substantial part by such a retailer, or by a parent or subsidiary thereof.

"(B) The retailer sells the same or substantially similar line of products as the retailer maintaining sales locations in California under the same or substantially similar business name, or facilities or employees of the related retailer located in this state are used to advertise or promote sales by the retailer to California purchasers."

Section 2 of A.B. 2412 would make legislative findings and declarations with respect to the construction, purpose, and intent of proposed subdivision (g). That section would read as follows:

"SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:

"(a) The amendment to Section 6203 of the Revenue and Taxation Code by this act is intended to clarify existing law.

"(b) This amendment is necessary in order to clarify that a retailer that is engaged in business in the state cannot be relieved of the nexus created by its location in the state through use of an affiliate, subsidiary, or related company, the purpose of which is to engage in similar transactions through the processing of orders by electronic means.

"(c) In amending Section 6203 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, it is not the intent of the Legislature to in any way extend or broaden the definition of retailer engaged in business in the state, but solely to clarify the definition for use by all retailers.

"(d) Pursuant to Section 3.5 of Article III of the California Constitution, the Legislature hereby directs the State Board of Equalization to fully enforce this act."

Although subdivision (a) of Section 2 of A.B. 2412 would declare that the addition of the proposed subdivision (g) to Section 6203 is intended to clarify existing law, this legislative declaration of intent would not be conclusive as to the effect of that proposed subdivision. In this regard, the courts are not bound by the statements of the Legislature, although a legislative statement is a factor to be considered in determining the meaning and effect of statutory provisions (*West Pico Furniture Co. v. Pacific Finance Loans* (1970) 2 Cal.3d 594, 609–610).

Consequently, proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203 must be examined to determine whether it would, if A.B. 2412 is enacted, only clarify the current meaning of the phrase "engaged in business in this state" as used in Section 6203, or instead substantively modify or change the current meaning of that phrase.

In this connection, paragraph (1) of proposed subdivision (g) specifies that a retailer is not, by virtue of the electronic processing of

orders, relieved of its duty to collect use tax, but would apply this specification only to a retailer that is otherwise "engaged in business in this state pursuant to this section." By conditioning the application of its substantive provisions upon a retailer being "engaged in business in this state" as otherwise provided by Section 6203, paragraph (1) of the proposed subdivision (g) indicates that it would not, by its own terms, purport to expand the current legal scope of that phrase. Instead, paragraph (1) only would purport to clarify that a retailer, required by other provisions of Section 6203 to collect use tax from purchasers, is not relieved of that requirement by reason of the electronic processing of orders placed with that retailer.

Paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) specifies that a retailer is presumed to have an agent within the state, for purposes of "being engaged in business in this state" as described by paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (c) of Section 6203, if certain conditions, regarding a nexus to a retailer maintaining sales locations in California, are met with respect to both a parent or subsidiary ownership interest (subpara. (A), para. (2), proposed subd. (g), Sec. 6203) and the types of products sold and the marketing of those products (subpara. (B), para. (2), proposed subd. (g), Sec. 6203).

An agent is generally defined to mean "one who represents another, called the principal, in dealings with third persons" (Sec. 2295, Civ. C.). Within the specific context of Section 6203, the decision in *Current, Inc.* v. *State Bd. of Equalization* (1994) 24 Cal.App.4th 382 (hereafter *Current*) sets forth those factors that would be utilized by a court to determine whether one retailer is an agent of another. In *Current,* the court relied upon the federal commerce clause "nexus" principles set forth in *Quill* to hold that California use tax collection responsibilities could not be properly imposed upon an out-of-state mail order company, wholly owned by a wholesale check corporation with a physical presence in California, under the authority of former subdivision (g) of Section 6203 <sup>2</sup> (*Current,* supra, at p. 391). In support of its holding, the court noted, among other things, that neither of the entities was "the alter ego or agent of the other for any purpose" (Ibid.). The court explained the basis for this statement, as follows:

"Neither Current nor Deluxe was the alter ego or agent of the other for any purpose. Neither solicited orders for the products of the other, and neither accepted returns of the merchandise of the other or otherwise assisted or provided services for customers of the other. Each owned, operated and maintained its own business assets, conducted its own business transactions, hired and paid its own employees,

and maintained its own accounts and records. Current and Deluxe did not have integrated operations or management. "Current and Deluxe were organized and operated as separate and distinct corporate entities. <u>Neither held itself out to customers or potential customers as being the same as, or an affiliate of, the other. Each had its own trade name, goodwill, marketing practices and customer lists and each marketed its products independently of the other. Neither exploited the trade name, corporate identification or goodwill of the other or purchased goods or services from the other." (*Current*, supra, at p. 388; emphasis added.)</u>

The factors set forth in the second paragraph above appear to be generally consistent with those criteria set forth in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203. In particular, the issues in *Current* of whether two entities hold themselves out as being identical or affiliated; share goodwill, trade names, or marketing practices; or exploit the trade name, corporate identification, or goodwill of the other, closely resemble the criteria utilized by subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203, namely, whether a retailer sells, under substantially the same business name, products similar to products sold by a retailer with sales locations in California, or whether the California facilities or employees of an in-state retailer are used to advertise or promote sales by an out-of-state retailer. As a result, paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203 could be reasonably construed to create a presumption, consistent with the nexus restrictions set forth in *Ouill*. that an out-of-state retailer is engaged in business in California through an agent in this state only if, in addition to a parent or subsidiary relationship to the purported agent, an agency relationship is indicated by factors similar to those common identity factors identified as requisite by the court in *Current*.

Subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of Section 2 of A.B. 2412, when read in light of basic principles of statutory construction, support this construction that A.B. 2412 would reflect existing law. In particular, subdivision (a) of Section 2 of A.B. 2412 would declare the Legislature's intent to "clarify" existing law, while subdivision (c) of Section 2 of A.B. 2412 would expressly state that "it is not the intent of the Legislature to in any way extend or broaden the definition of retailer engaged in business in this state." In addition, subdivision (b) of that same section indicates that the purpose of the proposed amendments made by A.B. 2412 to Section 6203 is to ensure that a retailer, engaged in business in this state, does not eliminate its tax "nexus" to California by means of a related entity engaged in the same types of sales made by electronic orders. It is axiomatic that the guiding star of statutory construction is the intention of the Legislature and that a statute is to be read in the light of its historical background and evident objective (State Compensation Ins. Fund v. Workers' Comp. Appeals Bd. (1979) 88 Cal.App.3d 43, 53). In view of this principle, we think that paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203 would, consistent with the Legislature's stated legal and policy objectives, be construed as requiring the application of existing principles of agency law, to clarify

the circumstances under which a retailer that is processing orders electronically is properly deemed to be "engaged in business in this state" under Section 6203, including the principles set forth in *Quill*.

In light of the foregoing discussion, it is our opinion that the amendment of Section 6203 as proposed by A.B. 2412 would (1) confirm the duty of a retailer processing orders electronically to collect California use tax if that retailer is otherwise required by law to collect that tax, and (2) presume that a retailer is "engaged in business in this state," by reason of having an agent in this state, only in those circumstances in which such an agency relationship is indicated by certain factors recognized by current law. Thus, we conclude that, in statutorily articulating the presumption set forth in paragraph (2) of proposed subdivision (g) of Section 6203, A.B. 2412 would only clarify, rather than expand, the substantive factors applied by existing law to determine whether an out-of-state retailer is, through the use of an agent, "engaged in business in this state" for purposes of Section 6203.

In addition, in our view, the substantive nature of the amendments to Section 6203 proposed by A.B. 2412 precludes that bill from being subject to the two-thirds legislative vote requirement of Section 3 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution.<sup>3</sup> In this connection, Section 3 of Article XIII A requires any change in state taxes enacted for the purpose of increasing revenues collected pursuant thereto to be passed by a two-thirds vote of each house of the Legislature. Section 3 of Article XIII A reads as follows:

"Section 3. From and after the effective date of this article [June 7, 1978 (Sec. 5, Art. XIII A and Sec. 4, Art. XVIII)<sup>4</sup>], any changes in state taxes enacted for the purpose of increasing revenues collected pursuant thereto whether by increased rates or changes in methods of computation must be imposed by an Act passed by not less than two-thirds of all members elected to each of the two houses of the Legislature, except that no new ad valorem taxes on real property, or sales or transaction taxes on the sales of real property may be imposed." (Emphasis added.)

The California Supreme Court found that Section 3 of Article XIII A is part of an interlocking package of provisions intended to achieve effective real property tax relief (*Amador Valley Joint Union High Sch. Dist.* v. *State Bd. of Equalization* (1978) 22 Cal.3d 208, 231). The court also stated that, because any tax savings resulting from the operation of property tax limitation provisions of the article (see Secs. 1 and 2, Art. XIII A) otherwise could be withdrawn or depleted by additional or increased state or local levies of other than property taxes, the provisions of the article relating to state taxes and local special taxes combine to place restrictions upon the imposition of those taxes (Id., at p. 231).

Section 3 of Article XIII A expressly applies to "changes in State taxes . . . whether by increased rates or changes in methods of

computation." As a result, that section would not apply to the amendments to Section 6203 proposed by A.B. 2412, which address only a retailer's duty to collect amounts of use tax, rather than the rate of the tax or the methods of computing that tax. Moreover, as discussed above, a retailer required to collect taxes by Section 6203 is not liable for the use tax itself, but is instead liable for an equivalent amount acting in the role of a collection agent (see *Montgomery Ward & Co. v. State Bd. of Equalization*, supra, at p. 743). Also, a retailer's use tax liability is in the nature of a debt, rather than a tax (Ibid.; see also Sec. 6204).

As a result, even if the amendments to Section 6203 proposed by A.B. 2412 would, if enacted, result in retailers increasing their collections of California use taxes, those increased collections would be the result of a clarification of collection requirements rather than a "change in State taxes" as described in Section 3 of Article XIII A. In this regard, the substantive legal distinction between the use tax collection burdens of retailers and use taxes themselves is, in our view, indicated by the separate set of limitations on those collection burdens set forth by the United States Supreme Court in *Quill*, supra.

In light of the foregoing discussion, we conclude that A.B. 2412 is not subject to the two-thirds legislative vote requirement of Section 3 of Article XIII A.

The final issue to be addressed is whether A.B. 2412 constitutes a tax levy measure as described in paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) of Section 8 of Article IV. In this regard, there is very little legal authority as to the definition of a tax levy measure as described by that constitutional provision. However, it is our view that a bill constitutes a tax levy if the principal purpose and object of that bill proposes a material change in tax burdens borne by taxpayers (see Senate Journal, 1963 First Ex. Sess., at pp. 103, 105; see also *Jones-Hamilton* v. *Franchise Tax Board* (1968) 268 Cal.App.2d 343). In contrast, it is also our view that this standard is not met by a bill that addresses only the administration or implementation of an existing tax.

As discussed above, the amendments to Section 6203 proposed by A.B. 2412 apply only to a retailer's use tax collection duties, and not to the rate or manner of calculation of the use tax itself. Thus, because A.B. 2412 addresses matters related only to the administration and implementation of the use tax, we conclude that A.B. 2412 does not constitute a tax levy.
