Re: 2023 Bargaining Unit 8, California Firefighters, and Bargaining Unit 9, Professional Engineers in California Government: Total Compensation Survey Results

Attached are total compensation surveys prepared by the Department of Human Resources (CalHR) for state firefighters, Bargaining Unit 8, represented by CAL FIRE Local 2881, and for state professional engineers, represented by Bargaining Unit 9, the Professional Engineers in California Government (PECG). These surveys are being submitted to be noted as available for review in the Daily Journals.

Government Code section 19827.3 requires that prior to recommending salaries for firefighters employed with the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, CalHR will “consider prevailing salaries and benefits” of local fire departments throughout California. Survey results show that when comparing state firefighter salaries with 20 local fire departments across California, used as benchmarks, state firefighter total compensation lags the benchmark classifications. However, the lag has declined from previous years.

Additionally, Article 3.1 of the current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the State and Bargaining Unit 9 (BU 9), PECG, requires a survey be completed comparing maximum salaries for three state engineering classifications to comparable classifications employed at 28 public-sector organizations in California, including 10 UC campuses. The three benchmark classifications included in the

survey represent engineers working at the entry level, journey level, and as first-level supervisors. The survey results indicate that the state lags the maximum base pay at all three levels. Current provisions of the BU 9 MOU explicitly state, “salary increases pursuant to this section shall not be provided during the term of this MOU.”
