Dear Mr. Wilson: On behalf of the Assembly, I, along with Senator De León, negotiated the recently enacted budget trailer bill, SB 73, to establish an implementation plan for the California Clean Energy Jobs Act (Proposition 39). The agreement funds energy projects at schools around the state upon approval of local expenditure plans.

The trailer bill requires the California Energy Commission to define specified criteria and determine ways to calculate the cost savings and benefits of Prop 39 projects. Local education agencies, prior to receiving their Prop 39 allocations, must demonstrate that their proposed projects meet those criteria. The trailer bill also provides that “All benefits of these public funds should be received by the school utilizing the facility.” For a school facility located in leased space, the Legislature’s intent in including that provision was to ensure that funds would not be distributed to these agencies for projects unless they can demonstrate that cost benefits will in fact result and that those benefits will be received directly by the agency.
