PRAYER

Upon invitation of Speaker pro Tempore Lowenthal, the following prayer was offered by Reverend Bob Oshita:

I'd like to share a story recollected by Arun Gandhi, the grandson of Mahatma Gandhi. In 1950, when he was sixteen, he was living with his parents at an Institute that his grandfather had founded. It was eighteen miles outside of Durban, South Africa, in the middle of cane fields. One day, his father asked him to drive him into town for a day-long meeting and to also have the car serviced. His father asked him to meet him at 5:00. Arun dropped off the car, then went to a movie. It was a John Wayne double feature, and he lost track of time. He ran to the garage, got the car, but it was 6:00 when he finally reached his dad. He lied to his father about the reason for being late, saying the car was not ready. His father knew his words were untrue.

No scolding came. Instead, Arun recalled that his father looked so sad, as he softly spoke to himself saying, "What kind of father am I, that my son is afraid to tell me the truth? I must ponder this . . .". Rather than getting into the car, his father began to walk home, contemplating his failure and how he must improve.

Arun said, ". . . in his suit and dress shoes, he began to walk home in the dark on mostly unpaved, unlit roads. I couldn't leave him, so for five and a half hours I drove behind him, watching my father go through agony over his failure as a father. I decided then and there that I was never going to lie again." Arun added, "My father's action was so powerful that it still feels like it happened yesterday." That one event changed Arun to his core and he said, "I now make the decision every morning to be better . . . and often wonder, if he had punished me, whether I would have learned a lesson at all. I don't think so."

Our fathers and mothers are our first and greatest teachers. If we are fortunate to have had such loving parents, in our hearts, every day let us quietly honor and thank them.

Namo Amida Butsu—Let us live with kindness and gratitude beyond words.
