RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Bargaining Unit 6, the California Correctional Peace Officers Association (CCPOA)

The California Department of Human Resources has reached a new Tentative Agreement/MOU with the union representing Bargaining Unit (BU) 6, the California Correctional Peace Officers Association (CCPOA). Upon approval by the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by employee membership, this agreement will be effective July 3, 2025, through July 2, 2028. In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, please accept the attached Tentative Agreement/MOU, including legislative and fiscal summaries.

Effective July 1, 2025, the Tentative Agreement/MOU adjusts compensation by providing a General Salary Increase (GSI) of three percent, and a GSI of three percent effective July 1, 2027. To address the budget shortfall, effective July 2025 through June 2027 pay periods, employees will be subject to the Personal Leave Program (PLP 2025). With the exception of specified classifications, each full time employee will continue to work their regular schedule, receive a three percent pay reduction, and be credited five PLP 2025 hours per month. Additionally, the employer's monthly contribution for prefunding Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB) will be suspended effective July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2027.

Finally, this agreement carries forward language from previous agreements and makes various other recruitment, retention, and labor changes.
