**RECESS**

By unanimous consent, at 9:09 a.m., Speaker pro Tempore Campos declared the Assembly recessed to permit the introduction of special guests.

Assembly Member Cooley arose to honor Winston Churchill Middle School's Science Olympiad Team. The 2013 Winston Churchill Science Olympiad Team participated in 23 events, from thermodynamics to structural engineering. In April, at the Northern California Science Olympiad Competition, the team won 18 medals and an invitation, for the third consecutive year, to the National Olympiad Championship.

At the National event in Dayton, Ohio, Winston Churchill Middle School placed fifth and earned a top team medal.

Assembly Member Cooley introduced Head Coach Jeffrey Jungk, and team representatives Marigot Fackenthal, Owen Frazier, and Sarah Gurev. These three students won individual medals at the national tournament: Marigot in astronomy, Owen in physics and music, and Sarah in the dynamic planet category. Assembly Member Cooley then presented each with a Members' Resolution.

The rest of the Olympiad Team, seated in the Gallery, included Muskaan Aggarwal, Claire Burch, Helen Burch, Patrick Chen, Adrienne Cloeter, Nikhil Gupta, Jeffrey Pimenta, Manu Prakasam, Ravina Sidhu, Vijay Srinivasan, Ella Treiterer, Mrunal Wakode, Sindhuja Vaidhyathan, and Christina Wong.

Assembly Member Muratsuchi arose to honor Brigadier General Robin Umberg as she retires from her exemplary service in the California Department of Veterans Affairs—she was promoted to Brigadier General in 2005, serving our country for a total of 36 years in combined active and reserve service as an Army soldier.

Brigadier General Umberg received numerous medals, which include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medals, Army Commendation Medals, Army Achievement Medal, Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal with a Bronze Service Star, and two Overseas Service Ribbons. She was presented the Civilian Humanitarian Service Medal from the Secretary of the Army in 1999.

In May 2011, Governor Jerry Brown appointed Brigadier General Umberg to the position of Undersecretary in the California Department of Veterans Affairs, responsible for the State Veterans Homes.

Assembly Member Muratsuchi was joined by Assembly Member Daly in commemorating the career and service of Brigadier General Umberg, whereupon they presented her with a Members' Resolution.

Assembly Member Daly introduced Brigadier General Umberg's husband, Hon. Tom Umberg, Member of the Assembly from 1990 to 1994 and 2004 to 2006.
