Dear Ms. Parker: As the author of Assembly Bill No. 341, I want to clarify the intent of Section 19961.07(a), related to modest table expansion.

It is the intent of this bill to allow a cardroom operating less than twenty (20) tables at the time the law becomes effective to expand by no more than an additional ten (10) tables. Allowing this gradual expansion from nineteen (19) or fewer tables to at most twenty-nine (29) tables will positively impact our communities.

I want to emphasize that Assembly Bill No. 341 results from careful negotiations and deliberations between various stakeholders and concerned interests. It represents a compromise that revives the moratorium on gambling expansion while allowing for limited growth. We aim to ensure that communities benefit from increased tax revenue and job opportunities without compromising the existing regulatory framework.
