RE: Letter to the Journal—Assembly Bill 844
(Chapter 731, Statutes of 2008)

Dear Mr. Wilson: I respectfully submit this Letter to the Journal to clarify the legislative intent of my AB 844, passed by this body in 2008.

AB 844 added Section 21608.5 to California’s Business and Professions Code. Section 21608.5(d) states in part: “This section shall not apply to the redemption of nonferrous material having a value of not more than twenty dollars (\$20) in a single transaction, when the *primary purpose* of the transaction is the redemption of beverage containers”

The intent of AB 844 was for “primary purpose” to mean that the value of the beverage containers would have to be worth more than the value of the nonferrous material being recycled. For example, to recycle \$20 worth of nonferrous material and not be subject to the requirements of Section 21608.5, an individual would have to recycle at least \$21 worth of beverage containers in the same transaction. It was not meant to allow individuals to recycle beverage containers worth less than \$20 with \$20 worth of nonferrous material without meeting the requirements of Section 21608.5.
