RE: Tentative Agreement/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
for Bargaining Unit 9, Professional Engineers

The California Department of Human Resources has reached a new Tentative Agreement/MOU with the union representing Bargaining Unit (BU) 9, Professional Engineers in California Government. Upon approval by the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by employee membership, the agreement will be effective July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2028. In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, please accept the attached Tentative Agreement/MOU, including legislative and fiscal summaries.

The Tentative Agreement/MOU adjusts compensation by providing a General Salary Increase (GSI) of 3 percent effective July 1, 2025. Effective July 1, 2027, all BU 9 classifications will receive a special salary adjustment, increasing the maximum salary range by 4.5 percent and increasing the minimum salary rate by 2 percent.

To address the budget shortfall, effective July 2025 through June 2027 pay periods, employees will be subject to the Personal Leave Program (PLP 2025), wherein each employee will continue to work their regular schedule and receive a 3 percent pay reduction in exchange for five hours PLP 2025 per month. Additionally, the return to office order is suspended for BU 9 employees until July 1, 2026, unless the agreement is not ratified by both parties.

Finally, this agreement carries forward language from previous agreements and makes various other recruitment, retention, and labor changes. The Tentative Agreement/MOU and summaries can also be found at <https://eservices.calhr.ca.gov/enterprisehrblazorpublic/public/mou/bargainingcontracts/9>.

RE: Tentative Agreement/Side Letter for Bargaining Unit 12, Craft and Maintenance Employees

The California Department of Human Resources has reached a new Tentative Agreement with the union representing Bargaining Unit (BU) 12, International Union of Operating Engineers. Upon approval by the Legislature and the Governor, and ratification by employee membership, this side letter extends the current MOU from June 30, 2026, through June 30, 2027. In accordance with Government Code Sections 3517.5, 19829.5, and Senate Rule 29.4, please accept the attached Tentative Agreement, including legislative and fiscal summaries.

The existing MOU contains a 4 percent increase to the maximum of the salary range for all BU 12 classifications, effective July 1, 2025. This agreement amends that provision, and instead, all BU 12 employees will receive a General Salary Increase (GSI) of 3 percent effective July 1, 2025.

To address the budget shortfall, effective July 2025 through June 2027 pay periods, employees will be subject to the Personal Leave Program (PLP 2025) wherein each full-time employee will continue to work their regular schedule and receive a 3 percent pay reduction in exchange for five hours of PLP 2025 per month.

On June 1, 2027, BU 12 represented employees will receive an additional 8 hours of PLP 2025. Additionally, the employer and employee monthly contribution for Other Post Employment Benefit Prefunding will be suspended beginning July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2027.

Finally, this agreement makes changes to employee retirement contributions effective July 1, 2025, by suspending the planned increase of employee retirement contributions until June 30, 2027.
